Job purpose

To provide specialist pharmacy technician expertise as part of a fixed term fellowship, co-facilitated by the GPhC and NHS England. The role will lead on key projects which contribute to national healthcare priorities, relating to patient safety, professional practice, and pharmacy education.

Main accountabilities

- Provide advice and leadership regarding pharmacy practice (as relevant to pharmacy technicians), including as a member of the NHSE Chief Pharmacy Officer Pharmacy Technician Professional Advisory Forum and similar national/strategic meetings.
- Assess information, evidence, and context to assist informed decision-making.
- Provide direct input whilst supporting others to progress workstreams, horizon scanning and communication with key stakeholders where pharmacy technician expertise is needed.
- Make professional evidence-based judgments using knowledge of legislation, GPhC standards and guidance, in accordance with relevant policies and procedures as well as established best practice.
- Maintain knowledge, skills and competencies in pharmacy, medicines optimisation, and the regulatory process by participating in appropriate training and required continuing professional development, and keep well informed about developments in pharmacy practice, including those using new or emerging technologies.
- Establish and sustain effective working relationships with teams across host organisations, providing specialist advice and quality assurance as appropriate.
- Identify and develop opportunities to improve skills, knowledge and understanding of others, including the production of training or support materials as appropriate.
- Ensure outcomes of workstreams consistently meet quality and house style standards and requirements.

• Work in accordance with organisational strategic objectives and policies, including sustainability, information security, business continuity, health and safety, equality, diversity, and inclusion.
